Election changes 2 on city council

Four incumbents retain their seats

There will be two new faces on the Marion City Council starting in January. However, neither of the newly elected members are unfamiliar around city hall.

Four of the five current council members seeking reelection retained their seats on the six-member, non-partisan board. Back will be Jim Brown (the top vote-getter Tuesday), Dwight Sherer, Jason Hatfield and Darrin Tabor.

Janet Pierce, a bank teller, won election to the board, but she had served two terms a few years ago. Pierce had

chosen not to run in 2004, but was re-elected this time as the No. 2 vote-getter.

Donnie Arflack, a technology specialist at the hospital, is the only true newcomer elected to the city council. However, Arflack is no stranger to local politics. He serves as chief of the Crittenden County Rescue Squad and has often attended public meetings and testified on behalf of emergency response programs for many years.

"It's going to be different on the other side," said Arflack, who often attends council meetings citv

requesting aid or services for the rescue squad or fire departments.

Arflack said he looks forward to working with the council and Mayor Mickey Alexander, who won a new four-year term Tuesday. Council members have to run for office every two years. "Like the mayor has said, I

think a new fire station is a top priority," Arflack said. "We need to upgrade the fire department equipment and equipment for police and streets department. The last

Former teacher elected to school board

Voters overwhelmingly put their confidence in retired teacher Eric LaRue, electing him for the county's only contested seat on the Crittenden County Board of Education. He beat incumbent Tina Harris and another former board member Stan Hoover in Tuesday's balloting.

Harris has been on the school board since she beat Hoover in 1998.

During attempts to knock on every door in his district – which includes the Tolu and Sheridan communities – LaRue said he heard voters' concerns about school safety and energy costs. At the same time, his travels down rural Crittenden County roads served as a reminder of some of the transportation issues that affect school buses.

LaRue has attended each school board

meeting since early 2005, so he's kept abreast of board issues. Between now and January he plans to continue researching solutions to high energy costs.

"I will be researching what alternatives we have to raising taxes, because no one wants that. But if energy prices do go back up we want to react as painlessly as possible.'
